

House Bills 2019

CHARTERS

HB 2192

Directs school districts and public charter schools to require every student in grades 6 through 12 to undergo mental health wellness check once each school year

HB 2261- Expands scope of levels of Quality Education Committee. (Not sure what the Quality Education Committee is or does)

HB- 2318-

Prohibits State Board of Education from requiring, and school districts from administering, certain assessments to students enrolled or preparing to enroll in prekindergarten through grade two

HB 2441 -

Requires school districts to provide coordinated comprehensive school counseling program

HB 2512-

Requires one member of State Board of Education to be engaged in teaching as licensed teacher

HB 2516-

Prohibits virtual public school from using moneys received as distributions from State School Fund or from other state or local public sources for paying expenses incurred for advertising or other promotional materials of school.

HB 2542-

Requires student to demonstrate proficiency in civics in order to receive high school diploma.

HB 2612-

Requires district school board to prohibit school district from being member of, or paying fees to, voluntary organization that administers interscholastic activities or that facilitates scheduling and programming of interscholastic activities if organization schedules any interscholastic activities on legal holidays or on weekends preceding or following legal holidays

PUBLIC

HB 2224-

Directs Department of Education to distribute grants for improving student outcomes by supporting social, emotional, mental and physical health needs of students.

HB 2246-

Directs Early Learning Division to develop plan for ensuring children seamlessly transition between mental health services.

HB 2262-

Modifies duties and membership of Early Learning Council. (Curious who that is and what they do?)

HB 2287-

Authorizes school district to allow firearm safety instruction on school property. (This is a very interesting bill considering all that is going on with the 2nd amendment here.)

HB 2290-

Directs education service districts to ensure that services of school behavioral health specialist are available to component school districts

HB 2326 -

Provides funding for grant program under which Department of Education awards grants to school districts for percentage of certain student transportation costs for which school district does not receive any amount in distributions from State School Fund or any amount related to transit activities.

*HB 2512-

Requires one member of State Board of Education to be engaged in teaching as licensed teacher.

*HB 2542-

Requires student to demonstrate proficiency in civics in order to receive high school diploma.

*HB 2612-

Requires district school board to prohibit school district from being member of, or paying fees to, voluntary organization that administers interscholastic activities or that facilitates scheduling and programming of interscholastic activities if organization schedules any interscholastic activities on legal holidays or on weekends preceding or following legal holidays.

HB2604-

Directs Department of Education to award grants to school districts to support safe schools by funding programs related to bullying prevention and youth empowerment

HB 2649-

Modifies process for revising form or notice sent to parents or adult students regarding statewide summative assessments.

HB 2673-

Directs Department of Education to create Oregon Educational Support Professional of Year Program.

HB 2676-

Increases threshold under which school district may receive additional State School Fund moneys for student eligible for special education

HB 2715-

Requires school districts to provide instruction on organ and tissue donation and education.

SENATE BILLS

2019

PUBLIC

SB12-

Establishes inclusive schools pilot program. (What could this be?)

SB 17-

Establishes Task Force on the Implementation of Electronic Transcripts in High School.

SB 18-

Allows Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to discipline administrator who fails to make report, follow specified procedures or provide written notification related to suspected abuse of child or sexual conduct by educator.

SB 180-

Directs Department of Education to award grants to school districts to support safe schools by funding programs related to bullying prevention and youth empowerment.

SB 216-

Allows person to be employed in public schools for 90 calendar days after date of submission of pending application for licensure only if person had not been employed during previous 12 months with pending application for same license.

GENERAL ODE Studies, Testing, and Revising

SB 153-

Directs Department of Education to conduct study on adequacy of education in state and report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2020

SB 154-

Directs Department of Education to conduct study to determine which statewide summative test to administer to students in grade 11.

SB 156-

Revises definitions of terms "school employee," "sexual conduct" and "student" for purposes of certain laws related to abuse and sexual conduct by school employees.

SB 157-

Directs Department of Education to administer nationally recognized assessment of high school students' knowledge and skills.

SB 217-

Modifies purposes for which grants paid from School Improvement Fund may be awarded.

SB 282-

Requires Department of Education, in cooperation with Oregon Health Authority, to conduct study to determine and recommend appropriate health standards to govern student use of computers, mobile digital devices and other electronic media in classrooms. (Interesting)

SB 283-

Directs Department of Education to prepare and make available statement that discloses potential

health risks of wireless network technology and requires public and private schools to distribute statement to employees, students and parents or guardians of students. (Another interesting one)

SB 589-

Creates Outdoor Education and Recreation Grant Program.
