How to Testify and Submit Written Testimony

NOTICE: All Board of Commissioners meetings will be completely virtual through the end of January.

The Washington County Board of Commissioners welcomes public participation at its regular business meetings.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Board remains committed to broad community engagement and transparency of government and will host virtual business meetings on Zoom.



To provide public testimony for a meeting via Zoom by phone or online, you must register using the form link [here](#). To register by phone call (503)846-8685.

- ▶ Submissions should be received 2 hours prior to the meeting time.
- ▶ Following registration, you will receive an email with further instructions.

Types of Testimony

Written Testimony

If you would like your written testimony considered by the Board prior to a specific Board meeting, please submit your testimony to Washcoclerk@co.washington.or.us no later than 2pm on the Monday before the Board Meeting.

This will not affect members of the public who submit testimony in person at a Board meeting. Their testimony will be included for the public record.

Testimony received after the deadline will be shared with the Board but not considered in their decision. If you have questions call the number noted above or email Washcoclerk@co.washington.or.us.

Washington County: Tracking and Testifying

Oral Testimony during a Board meeting

1. Testimony on Items on the Agenda

Anyone wishing to speak on an agenda item at a regular business meeting should feel free to do so. In doing so, the Board asks that the following guidelines be observed:

- ▶ Please follow registration procedures listed above.
- ▶ When your name is announced, state your name for the record.
- ▶ Groups or organizations wishing to make a presentation are asked to designate one spokesperson in the interest of time and to avoid repetition.
- ▶ When more than one person is heard on any matter, please avoid repetition in your comments. Careful attention to the previous speaker's remarks will be helpful in this regard.

Public Hearing Time Limits*

Two (2) minutes per individual and five (5) minutes for groups

Ordinance Testimony Time Limits

- ▶ First hearing - 3 minutes for individuals and 12 minutes for groups
- ▶ Additional hearings - 2 minutes for individuals and 5 minutes for groups

2. Oral Communication from the Public **

There are two opportunities for oral communication with the Board:

- ▶ **First Opportunity:** At the start of the meeting, before Board adoption of the consent agenda. This opportunity is time-limited to two (2) minutes per individual and a maximum of 10 minutes total.
- ▶ **Second Opportunity:** At the conclusion of all regular business. This second opportunity is time-limited to five (5) minutes per individual and a maximum of 30 minutes total. This period may include communications on agenda items for which no period for public testimony was provided.

* Notwithstanding the above, the Presiding Officer may limit the time and number of persons appearing in the interest of facilitating the orderly business of the Board, unless a majority of the Board rules otherwise.

** No comments are allowed during "oral communication" on items already on the agenda for a public hearing.
