packed, sorted, set up and marked more stuff than ever. Members donated quality items. Members Betty Atteberry and Dorothy Merritt made significant donations when they downsized from their well-appointed homes to retirement communities. Member Denise Renner and husband, Roy, always keep BHRW in sellable furniture and clothing as they update their home and lifestyle. BHRW friend, Paula Vial, helped set up and provided six more, sorely needed, banquet tables. Paula also generously treated the set-up crew to lunch and even came back later to shop!

It would be impossible to name all those who

helped, but 20 members donated items, 15 members helped sell (many for multiple days), 9 members provided needed food and beverages, and



7 members helped to pack up over 50 boxes of unsold items.



BHRW donated boxed goods of unsold items to the Vietnam Veterans of America Association that sponsors the Red, White and Blue thrift stores in Oregon and

Washington. Betty Atteberry delivered nearly all remaining clothing and upscale household items to the Assistance League of Portland, located in Beaverton and additionally delivered seven boxes of remaining books to the Hillsboro Library.

Where does our money go?

In addition to our annual garage sale, we have other sources of income such as membership dues, special events, basket drawings, and donations. Together they earn BHRW about \$4,500 each year. But where does this money go?

First, we pay our national dues to National Federation of Republican Women and Oregon Federation of Republican Women to support their national and state programs and expenses. The BHRW expenses include supporting the officers and members to attend and participate in OFRW and NFRW important meetings and leadership training to help BHRW grow stronger. Other expenses include website maintenances, speaker expenses, event planning, office supplies/printing, gifts and remembrances.

It is important to note BHRW does NOT contribute to any candidate or candidate campaign. The

IRS code under which BHRW is organized precludes any cash donations. BHRW supports candidates and their campaigns through speaking opportunities, and club volunteer activities, but no funds flow from BHRW to any candidate or campaign. However, members are not limited in their private activities supporting candidates.

Finally, most BHRW funds go to charitable organizations, agreed to by the members, that help individuals in the Beaverton Hillsboro area:

- We support *five scholarships* (national and local) each year.
- We donate books and funds to Beaverton and Hillsboro libraries as part of our Mamie Eisenhower/Barbara Bush library project.
- We celebrate veterans by hosting an annual veterans' dessert and games night (with prizes!) at the Salvation Army Veterans and Family Center Salvation in Beaverton. We also donated a refrigerator and meal containers to the Center.
- We donate funds to the *Oregon Honor Flight* which escorts WWII, Korean War, and Vietnam War veterans to see their memorials and others in Washington, D.C. At the end of the 2017 flying season, the Honor Flight had escorted over 200,000 veterans, free of cost to the veterans.
- We donate funds to the *USO* for calling cards for active military.
- Our funds support the *Lines for Life*, a mental health crisis line and suicide prevention program.
- We support Washington County Community Action whose mission is to eliminate conditions of poverty and create opportunities for people and communities to thrive.

In addition to distributing funds, BHRW organizes members' donations to the Veterans and Family Center toiletries closet and to the Union Mission Gospel Women's LifeChange Center.

Our members canvas and call for local candidates, testify at legislative hearings, and staff voter registration efforts.

Like all good Republicans, BHRW is frugal. Club expenses are minimal. The BHRW Board proposes an annual budget and the membership votes to approve it, usually after candid analysis. The Ways and Means Committee likes to make money to make our programs possible. And like good Republicans, BHRW has money put away for a rainy day!


