

Gov. Nikki Haley Gives State of the Union Response



Republican leaders tapped South Carolina Governor Nikki Haley to deliver the official Republican address following President Obama's State of the Union speech on Tuesday night. Haley is the third consecutive woman to deliver the GOP response, given by Iowa Senator Joni Ernst in 2015 and House Republican Conference Chair Cathy McMorris Rodgers in

2014.

The 116th Governor of South Carolina, Haley is the state's first female and first minority governor and the youngest governor serving in the country. Elected to a second term in November 2014, Haley is one of three Republican women currently leading their states, along with Susana Martinez in New Mexico and Mary Fallin in Oklahoma.



Book Review

How To Be Right: The Art of Being Persuasively Correct by Greg Gutfeld

Greg Gutfeld has been called "outrageous and outspoken," neither of which he denies. A libertarian



political satirist, humorist, magazine editor and blogger, he is perhaps best known as the co-host of the hit show "The Five" and is also host of "The Greg Gutfeld Show" on the Fox News Channel where he parodies current events on a weekly basis and converses on key issues, bringing a comedic twist to the news.

He is the author of five books, among them, two New York Times Best Sellers, "Not Cool" and "The Joy of Hate" along with "The Bible of Unspeakable

Truths," which garnered praise and pithy quotes from the likes of Dennis Miller, Mike Huckabee, Ann Coulter and Andrew Breitbart who said: "Trust me, you don't want him setting his sights on your hypocrisy and public failings." Consider yourself warned.

In his latest book. How To Be Right: The Art of Being Persuasively Correct, he says: "It's not enough to be right, these days—especially when you're not left."

To survive, the right must learn how to express nonliberal principles as effectively as possible, and persuade others of their point of view. It is an art that demands patience, research, humor, understanding, creative thinking, learning from your opponent and even mimicking their tactics.
