### 15 Remarkable Republican Women You Can Help Elect on Tuesday

While the list is far from exhaustive, these profiles give you a flavor of the remarkable Republican women running for office across the country.



#### Martha McSally (U.S. Senate, AZ)

As the first American woman to pilot a fighter jet in combat, **Martha McSally** has one of the most impressive resumes in America, but she's not finished yet. After serving two terms in Congress, McSally is running for Arizona's open Senate seat – a high stakes, must-win race to maintain the Republican majority. Read more [here](#).

#### Susan Hutchison (U.S. Senate, WA)

Running in a historically blue state isn't easy, but former television journalist and chair of the Washington State GOP **Susan Hutchison** is up for the challenge. #### Maria Elvira Salazar (U.S. House, FL-27)



A household name throughout Florida's 27th congressional district, Emmy-winning political journalist **Maria Elena Salazar** is stepping up to fill the seat of the first Hispanic woman elected to Congress, **Ileana Ros-Lehtinen**. ### Carol Miller (U.S. House, WV-03)

With a motto of "cut the bull out of politics," **Carol Miller** is running for the U.S. House of Representatives from West Virginia's third district. A small business owner, farmer, and first female majority whip of the West Virginia state house, she wants to take West Virginia values to Washington and support President Trump's agenda. ### Amie Hoeber (U.S. House, MD-06)

### Karin Housely (U.S. Senate, MN)

### **Marsha Blackburn (U.S. Senate, TN)**

### **Chele Chiavacci Farley (U.S. Senate, NY)**
